



Lazy Harry at the Robert O'Hara Burke Memorial Museum

Tour groups visiting Beechworth can now enjoy the talents of one of Australia's most successful singers, raconteurs and recording artists in the unique surrounds of the **Burke Museum's *Street of Shops***.

Lazy Harry, alias Mark Stephens, is available daily for 45-minute seated performances of his original Australian folk songs and bush ballads in this fantastic venue.

The ***Street of Shops*** is one of Beechworth's most popular drawcards. A meticulously detailed, scaled reproduction of a gold era Beechworth featuring 16 businesses operating in Beechworth during the Gold Rush era, the ***Shops*** are also fascinating display rooms for many of the Burke Museum's thousands of artefacts.

They include a coaching office, medical hall, dancing salon, ironmongery, drapery, bazaar, watchmaker and jeweller and newsagent.



The ***Street of Shops*** offers a perfect setting for groups to be entertained by Lazy Harry, whose stage name was inspired by one of his favourite rollicking songs celebrating the life and times of the itinerant workers of the 19th century.

Lazy Harry has 10 CDs and three DVD albums to his credit, featuring more than 100 traditional and original tracks. His music is played throughout Australia and overseas and he is often featured on national radio
