To Celebrate its 20th Birthday

Beechworth Town Hall

130 Ford St Beechworth

Enjoy the architecture of the Beechworth Town Hall built by Donald Fiddes and view the Tapestry, built in 1859 the restoration of the Town Hall in the 1980's was the inspiration for the commissioning of the Beechworth Town Hall Tapestry that now hangs on the northern wall of the Hall. See the watercolour and collage that were the working references for the final work. Open daily from 9 am – 5 pm.

Visit the Telegraph Station Oral History Room and listen to Leonie Bessant on the handset.

The Beechworth Town Hall Tapestry was designed by Melbourne-based artist Leonie Bessant who has designed a number of significant tapestries, including *Paradise in Trust*, a suite of six tapestries hanging in the arrivals hall in Melbourne's International Airport. She was also the senior weaver for the Arthur Boyd tapestry that hangs in Parliament House, Canberra. In 2000 Leonie recorded these recollections of her experiences of working with the local community and weaving the tapestry.

Burke Memorial Museum

Loch Street Beechworth

See the artworks from the art collection of the Burke Museum, also documents and objects from the Museum's collection that inspired the designer of the tapestry and the group of Beechworth Arts Council members who assisted with selecting the ideas and resources for the design.

'Reedy Creek Falls'

Colour lithograph by Eugene Von Guerard [1811-1901] Depicting the landscape of the Reedy Creek Falls [now called Woolshed Falls], Von Guerard chose this dramatic place with its statuesque Black Cypress Pine (*Callitris Endlicheri*) to record the landscape on his visit to Beechworth.

'Wallace Illuminated Address'

This address was presented to local mining magnate John Alston Wallace in appreciation of his contribution and the community's contributions to the Beechworth Benevolent Asylum. The pink ribbons from the address add a flourish to the Tapestry.

Chinese characters

Borrowed from a processional banner commissioned and made in China they were shipped to Beechworth and were displayed by the Chinese community as part of the parade for the Charity Carnival held in May 1873 to commemorate the Prince of Wales birthday and to raise funds for the Beechworth hospitals. The characters translate as 'Wishing Prosperity to the Undertaking' and the translation was made the then owners of Beechworth Village Restaurant.

Cheapside House

Owned by John Armstrong this was a large drapery store in Ford Street. He was there in 1886 and by 1900 owned the premises and was still there in 1916 and died soon afterwards.

The Nodding Blue Lily (Stypandra glauca)

Featured in the top right hand corner of the Tapestry, the Nodding Blue Lily with its delicate blue flowers can be seen in spring time (September-October) in the Historic Park, the Gorge and other areas close to the town of Beechworth

Superb Blue Wren

Commonly resident in patchy undergrowth in forest and woodland they are abundant in the Beechworth area.

Cheapside House

53 Ford St Beechworth

Now Beechworth Toys & Collectables, its facade and shop front has changed little since the 19th Century.

Spring Creek Diggings

Walk or drive from Ford Street along Albert Road to Lower Stanley Road and look across Lake Sambell, the Chinese Gardens, Albert Road and Spring Creek to view the scene depicted in the woodcut of the Spring Creek diggings. The area around Temple Street was the site of the Chinese Village. Across the Lake are the silhouettes of the iconic buildings of Ford Street.

Woolshed Falls

Walk in the Beechworth Historic Park or enjoy a picnic or BBQ at Woolshed Falls. See the beautiful granite formations and the landscape of the Woolshed Falls and be inspired by the spectacular rocky scenery of the falls and the superbly symmetrical and graceful local pine trees (*Callitris Endlicheri*) so characteristic of the landscape on the Beechworth plateau

Beechworth Historic Park

Nodding Blue Lily (Stypandra glauca) can be seen abundantly in early spring with its delicate intense blue flowers.

Black Cypress Pine Trees (Callitris Endlicheri) depicted by Eugene Van Guerard at Reedy Falls can be seen in the hills on the northern side of Beechworth, the Gorge Drive and in Beechworth Historic Park.

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
